SCHEME FOR OPTING SUBJECTS B.A./B.Sc. (GENERAL) FIRST YEAR (SEMESTER SYSTEM) EXAMINATION, 2021-2022

B.A. (General) 1st Year (Semester System) study programme consists of three compulsory subjects and three elective subjects :

Compulsory subjects:

(a) Punjabi

OR

History & Culture of Punjab

- (b) English
- (c) Environment, Road Safety Education, Violence against Wornen/Children and Drug Abuse ***

Elective Subjects: A student is required to take up 3 elective subjects in all, selecting not more than one subject from any of the following sets of combinations.;

- 1. English, Hindi, Punjabi, ** Bengali, Urdu, Persian, ** Tamil, French, ** Arabic, Russian, German, ** Kannada, ** Malayalam, ** Telugu.
- 2. Economics, Defence & Strategic Studies, Fine Arts, Education, Adult Education, History of Art.
- 3. History, Mathematics.
- 4. Public Administration, Home Science, Gandhian Studies, Philosophy.
- 5. Political Science, * Statistics, Applied Statistics; Indian Classical Dance, Human Rights and Duties.
- 6. Sanskrit, Physical Education, Ancient Indian History, Culture & Archaeology, Psychology, Geography.
- 7. Computer Science, Agriculture, Sociology.
- 8. Music (Instrumental), Women's Studies, Music (Tabla), Environment Conservation, Religious and Sikh Studies
- 9. Music (Vocal), Police Administration, Journalism & Mass Communication.

Note: The students can opt. only two elective subjects from the following:

Music (Instrumental), Music (Vocal), Music (Tabla) and Indian Classical Dance.

- Statistics can be opted only with Mathematics
- ** The Syllabus of Tamil, Telugu, Kannada, Malayalam, Arabic & Bengali Languages are kept in abeyance
- *** This is a compulsory qualifying paper, which the students have to study in the B.A./B.Sc. 1st year (2nd Semester). If the student/s failed to qualify the paper during the 2nd Semester, he/she/they be allowed to appear/qualify the same in the 4th or 6th Semester/s.

Streams of Learning

The college is affiliated to Panjab University, Chandigarlı for the following streams:

UNDERGRADUATE COURSES

Eligibility:

Students should have cleared +2 examination (any stream) from PSEB or any other equivalent examination recognized by P.U. Chandigarh.

The College offers the following combinations of subjects:

Compulsory Subjects (for all Groups)

- 1. Compulsory English
- 2. Compulsory Punjabi or History and Culture of Punjab
- 3. Environment Education

Note: Environment Education is the compulsory paper which the candidates are required to pass with at least 33% marks in 1", 2" or 3" year of the Course, failing which the degree will not be issued.

Note: Only those students can opt for History and Culture of Punjab in lieu of Compulsory Punjabi who have passed Matriculation from an institution situated outside Punjab.

Note: Only those students who have passed Matriculation Examination without Panjabi will be allowed to take the subject of History and Culture of Punjab in B.A.I, B.Com.I, BCAI and BBA-I.

B.A. (Arts Group)

Elective Subjects - Choose any three:

- I Elective English/Punjabi /Hindi
- II Economics/Fine Arts
- III History/Music Vocal/Journalism and Mass Communication
- IV Psychology / Physical Education / Music Instrumental
- V Home Science/Public Administration
- VI Political Science/Office Management & Secretarial Practice
- VII Sociology/Computer Science

Note: (i) As per Panjab University rules, students opting for Practical Subjects cannot appear privately.

- (ii) Environment Education is compulsory for all the students of Arts, Computer Science & Commerce Group i.e. B.A.I/B.Com.I/BCA-I/BBA-I
- (iii) Out of three elective subjects, only two practical subjects are allowed.
- (iv) In B.A./B.Com/BCA/BBA, if a candidate has not qualified 50% papers up to 2nd or 4th semester, she will not be promoted in 3rd and 5th semester respectively.

Syllabus of Master of Arts (English)

General Directions

- 1. The entire course of M.A. (English) consists of 18 (eighteen) papers. Semester I &II shall have four papers each (a total of 8 out of which four shall be compulsory and four optional); Semester III & IV shall also have tive papers each (a total of 10 out of which two shall be compulsory and eight optional). One paper (paper XIII) shall be allotted to dissertationwork. If a student does not want to undertake dissertation-work, he/she can opt for a paper named 'Research Methods'. One more paper—'skill Enhancement/Social Outreach' (paper XVIII, Sem IV) based on practical training is to be opted in the second year. In case a student does not want to take this paper based on practical skills, he/she can opt for paper named 'Creative Writing and Soft Skills'. The details of these papers (XIII & XVIII) along with their corresponding alternatives appear later in the document.
- 2. At the beginning of every session, each department would announce the options it would offer to students on the basis of available resources.
- 3. There are two compulsory papers in Semester I, and correspondingly in Semester II, whereas in Semester III & IV, there is only one compulsory paper each semester.
- 4. For the optional papers, the students are advised to choose corresponding options across the semesters. For instance, anyone who opts 'Academic Writing -I' in Semester I, for sake of specialization, is advised to opt for 'Academic Writing -II'. Similarly anyone who opts 'Cultural Studies -I' in Semester I, for the sake of specialization, is advised to opt for 'Cultural Studies -II'.
- 5. All the books prescribed as well as suggested are available either online or in the printed form. The teachers are expected to teach only those parts or excerpts (of the texts) that have been prescribed in the course.
- 6. Each paper shall be evaluated both internally and externally. Out of a total of 100 marks per paper, each candidate shall be externally evaluated for 80 marks, and internally evaluated for 20. The internal assessment would be given on the basis of attendance (5 marks), class participation (5 marks) and mid-term examination (10 marks). The papers (except Paper XIII that involves Dissertation-work & Paper XVIII which is based on practical skills) across all the semesters have been divided into five units. In the final examination of each paper, five questions (one from each unit) would be asked with internal choice. Each question shall carry 16 marks with a word limit of about 500- 600words.

7. Those appearing in the capacity of private candidates shall be evaluated externally only. For them each paper shall carry 100 marks (20X5=100)

Instructions for private candidates and all those regular candidates who do not want to opt for dissertation work in paper XIII & Skill Enhancement/Social Outreach paper XVIII:

- 1. Paper XIII offers an internal choice. Either the student opts for dissertation or a paper named as 'Research Methods'
- 2. Paper XVIII also offers an internal choice. Either the student opts for 'Skill Enhancement/Social Outreach' or he/she appears in a paper named 'Creative Writing and Soft Skills'. This would mean that the candidate in Sem IV shall have a total of five papers (one compulsory and four optional).
