The paradigmatic shifts in education policy and the requirements of the stakeholders led to the formation of an amended perspective plan for the session 2022-23. The plan was primarily reviewed as per the needs of learners keeping in view the higher education policies of the nation. The Perspective plan draft was prepared and discussed with the members of IQAC for their approval. After reviewing, they approved the following plan after making necessary modifications.

#### I. Curricular Aspects

Giving due consideration to the demand of students for a wide variety of courses, the college plans to introduce skill oriented courses like **Bachelor of Library (B.Lib.)** in the coming session. The college also plans to introduce new subjects at undergraduate level. **New Elective Subjects** in B.A. are being considered as potential options for career opportunities for the students. All these courses will be affiliated to Panjab University, Chandigarh.

#### **II.** Teaching, Learning and Evaluation

- 1. A number of innovative academic activities will be organized by the college at departmental level for the benefit of the students.
- 2. Under the Indian Presidency, the G20 in 2023 will focus on the theme, 'One Earth, One Family, One Future' (*vasudhaiva kutumbakam*). India's presidency will begin on December 01, 2022, leading up to the summit in the third quarter of 2023. In this session, the college plans to spearhead different activities under G-20 and pronounces maximal participation in programs conducted by other colleges/ agencies on G-20.
- Emphasis will be laid on more guest lectures on various themes/ subjects for wider exposure.
- 4. The college aims at inclusive education, so efforts will be made to enroll students from rural, backward, economically and socially backward section of society.
- 5. The college always aims at providing a congenial atmosphere to students coming from other states and disparate cultural backgrounds.
