





6.2 - Strategy Development and Deployment

6.2.1 - The institutional Strategic/ perspective plan is effectively deployed

The college formulated a comprehensive perspective development plan in 2021, which undergoes annual revision to ensure its relevance and effectiveness. In response to paradigm shifts in education policy and evolving stakeholder needs, an updated perspective plan was devised for the 2023-24 session. This review focused primarily on addressing learners' requirements in alignment with the nation's higher education policies.
