


CODE OF CONDUCT PROGRAMMES 2024-25

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The College has prescribed code of conduct that is uploaded on the college website. Students as well as teaching and non-teaching staff are regularly made aware of this code of conduct through various meetings and communications. Additionally the code of Conduct Committee along with other departments and clubs organises several activities and seminars aimed at fostering moral and ethical values among students. and sensitize them about various social, economic and environmental issues.

June 03, 2024

Meeting with the non-teaching and supporting staff regarding the code of conduct of the college

Under the aegis of the IQAC, Madam Principal Dr. Maneeta Kahlon conducted a meeting with the non-teaching and supporting staff of the college on June 3, 2024. The primary objective of this meeting was to raise awareness about the college's code of conduct.

During the meeting, Madam Principal outlined the key aspects of the code of conduct, emphasizing the importance of professionalism, integrity, and ethical behavior in the workplace. The discussion included detailed explanations of the expected standards for behavior, interactions with students and colleagues, and adherence to college policies.

She also highlighted specific scenarios to illustrate proper conduct, addressing common issues and providing guidance on handling various situations appropriately. This session provided an opportunity for the non-teaching and supporting staff to ask questions and seek clarifications. Madam Principal also reminded the staff of the importance of everyone's contribution in upholding the college's reputation and fostering a culture of mutual respect and cooperation.

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July 16, 2024

Organize an Induction Program for the first year UG students

The college organized an induction program for the first year UG students of the college on July 16, 2024. Its primary objective was to acquaint them with the college code of conduct. During the programme, students were introduced to the ethical standards, behavioral expectations, and regulations that define the college environment. Code of conduct meeting with the staff

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August 01, 2024



The session proved to be an informative and beneficial initiative for the students, equipping them with the necessary knowledge to confidently approach their upcoming examinations

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
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Celebration of Sangrand every month

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
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January 22, 2025


Principal Dr. Maneeta Kahlon, expressed her gratitude to the speaker and highlighted the need such motivational lectures for the students.


