



WORLD ANTI-HUMAN TRAFFICKING DAY




World Anti-Human Trafficking Day was observed in the college campus on July 30, 2024 with a special event to raise awareness about the grave issue of human trafficking.

INDIAN ORGAN DONATION DAY







MINORITIES RIGHTS DAY






