MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is entered into at Ludhiana on this 19th day of July, 2024 by and between -

1. Guru Nanak Khalsa College for Women, Model Town, Ludhiana, Punjab, India (hereinafter referred to as the "College", which expression shall unless repugnant to the context or meaning hereof include its successors and permitted assigns), being the party of the First Party.

and

2. Bulls Eye Knowledge System Limited (BEKSL), a company incorporated under the Companies Act 1955, having its registered office at SCO 66-67, Madhya Marg, Sector 8C, Chandigarh (herein after referred to as the "institute")-an institute which has been providing premier education services with unique expertise and parameters in human capital training and development. Hitbullseye has grown to become one of the leaders in Test Prep in India. Hitbullseye is engaged in providing training in CAT exam (the premier exam for admission into MBA courses in India), CUET, CLAT (Law entrance test), IPMAT, GMAT, GRE, and Placement Tests and other, being the party of the Second Party.

The College and the institute are collectively referred to as "Parties", and individually as "Party".

- A.. The College is one of the leading educational institutions of Punjab and is engaged in imparting quality education through graduate and post-graduate streams of Arts, Commerce, Management, Computer Science, Science, Fashion Designing and various other vocational and add-on courses;
- B. The institute is known for its innovation in the education industry. Across North India, it is the fastest growing test preparation company in the Bank P.O domain and for the examinations such as CAT, CUET, IPMAT, CLAT, GMAT, GRE & Campus Placements Aptitude Training to students who are on threshold of their career to brighten their future prospects.

The College has approached the institute for its association and support for providing aptitude development, communication skills training and personality development course and the institute has agreed to provide the same as per details contained in this MOU hereinafter;

The Parties agree to establish academic collaboration in areas of mutual interest and in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in this MOU:

- The College and the institute shall promote development by various means, including but not limited to the following:
 - a) The College and the institute shall collaborate and run a Personality Development program under which workshops will be organized in respect to preparation of competitive exams for students to mentor, motivate and guide them in order to make them aware. b) The institute will also organize personality development workshop for the students of the college by providing soft skills training, leadership skills sessions on personal grooming, body language, time management, etiquettes and social and professional protocols. c) Any other areas as may be worked out mutually between the college and the institute

c) Any other areas as may be worked out mutually between the college and the institute from time to time for benefit of the students.

- During the tenure of the MOU, both the college and the institute will maintain strict confidentiality and prevent disclosure of all the information and data exchanged under the scope of this MOU for any purpose other than in accordance with this MOU
- 3. This MOU shall be effective from the date of its approval by competent authorities at both ends. The duration of the MOU shall be for a period of 1 year from the effective date. During its tenancy, the MOU may be extended or terminated by a prior notice of not less than three months by either party. However, termination of the MOU will not in any manner affect the interests of the students/faculty who have been admitted to pursue a program under the MOU.
- 4. Any amendment to the MOU shall be in writing and signed by the Parties hereto and shall only after such execution be deemed to form part of the MOU and have the effect of modifying the MOU to the extent required by such amendment or addenda.
- 5. This MOU shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of India. Any dispute or difference or any question of interpretation of any of the provisions of this MOU arising before, during the pendency of, or after the expiry of this MOU, shall be subject to the sole and exclusive jurisdiction of Courts at Ludhiana.



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter called as the 'MOU') is entered into on this the 29th DAY of May, Two Thousand and Twenty Four by and between

<u>Guru Nanak Khalsa College for Women</u>, Gujarkhan Campus, Gujarkhan Road, Model Town, hereinafter called as the 'THE FIRST PARTY'

AND

OnCampus, an initiative of ESH Value Technologies Private Limited, New Diamond Avenue, 27 Feet Road, Majitha Road, Amritsar, Punjab, India,143001, hereinafter called as the 'THE SECOND PARTY'

PURPOSE OF MOU

In particular, this MOU is intended to

- Enhance students' capabilities and skills by providing comprehensive teaching and upskilling programs administered by the First Party.
- Facilitate the delivery of courses through online platforms, ensuring accessibility and flexibility for students enrolled in the programs.
- Strengthen the placement opportunities for students affiliated with the First Party by establishing partnerships with multinational corporations and startups.

Furthermore, it is agreed that:

- 4. The services provided shall be subject to charges, wherein students will be responsible for payment of their upskill courses fees. Revenue generated from these services shall be shared between the First and Second parties, with the specific percentage to be determined through mutual discussions.
- The Second Party shall conduct promotional sessions offline as and when required, while the delivery of upskill courses will predominantly occur online, in accordance with the structured program agreed upon by both parties.

NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL PROMISES SET FORTH IN THIS MOU, THE PARTIES HERETO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

Clause 1

CO-OPERATION

- 1.1 Both parties are united by common interests and objectives, and they shall establish channels of communication and co-operation that will promote and advance their respective operations. The parties shall keep each other informed of potential opportunities and share all information that may be relevant to secure additional opportunities for one another.
- 1.2 The cooperation between First Party and Second Party will facilitate effective utilization of the intellectual capabilities of the Second Party providing significant inputs to them in developing suitable teaching/ training systems, keeping in mind the needs of the First Party.

Clause 2

SCOPE OF THE MOU

- 2.1 Both parties believe that close co-operation between the two would be a major benefit to the student community to enhance their skills and knowledge.
- 2.2 The Second Party will give valuable inputs to the First Party in the placement process journey of students so that the students fit into the industrial scenario meaningfully.
- 2.3 The interaction between Industry and College Centre will give an insight into the latest developments /requirements of the industries; the Second Party to permit the Faculty and Students of the First Party be involved in Industrial Training Programs for the First Party. The industrial training and exposure provided to students through this association will build confidence and prepare the students to have a smooth transition from academic to working career.
- 2.4 The Second Party will train the students of the First Party on the emerging technologies in order to bridge the gap in skill and make them ready for industry.
- 2.5 The Second Party will extend the necessary support to deliver online lecturers to the students of the First Party on the technology trends and industry requirements.
- 2.6 The Second Party will actively engage to help the delivery of the training and placement of students of the First Party into jobs.

Clause 3

VALIDITY

- 3.1 The validity of the agreement is one year from the date of agreement.
- 3.2 Both Parties may terminate this MOU upon 15 calendar days' notice in writing. In the event of Termination, both parties have to discharge their obligations.

Non-disclosure Agreement

This Non-disclosure Agreement ("Agreement") is effective as of 29th May, 2024 ("Effective Date") and is entered into by and between:

<u>Guru Nanak Khalsa College for Women</u>, with its principal office at Gujarkhan Campus, Gujarkhan Road, Model Town, Ludhiana, Punjab 141002 ("**Disclosing Party**")

and

OnCampus, an initiative of ESH Value Technologies Private Limited with principal place of business at 123-New Diamond Avenue, Amritsar, Punjab ("Receiving Party")

for the purpose of securing any information which the Disclosing Party will disclose to the Receiving Party in relation to an ongoing or a possible future business relationship.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, and conditions contained herein, the sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

1. Definition of Confidential Information.

Confidential Information means any information or materials furnished by the Disclosing Party to the Receiving Party orally, or in written or electronic form, which is confidential, proprietary, or otherwise not generally available to the public.

2. Exclusions from Confidential Information.

The following information shall not be treated as Confidential Information.

- Information which was in the Receiving Party's possession prior to receipt from the Disclosing party
- is independently developed by the Receiving Party
- was in the public domain at the time of receipt from Disclosing party
- lawfully received by the Receiving Party from a third party without any breach of this Agreement.

3. Obligations of Receiving Party

Receiving Party shall take the same degree of care that it uses to protect its own confidential and proprietary information of similar nature and importance (but in no event less than reasonable care). Receiving Party shall not, without prior written approval of the Disclosing Party, publish, copy, or otherwise disclose, divulge, decompile, disassemble or permit the use by others for their benefit or to the detriment of the Disclosing Party, any Confidential Information. Receiving Party shall restrict access to Confidential Information to its authorised employees, contractors, and agents who have a need to know the Confidential Information and shall require such

persons/entities to execute confidentiality restrictions at least as protective as those contained in this Agreement.

4. Return of Confidential Information.

Receiving Party shall return to the Disclosing Party the Confidential Information in its possession on the request of the Disclosing Party.

5. Term

The confidentiality provisions of this Agreement shall survive for a period of one (1) year following the termination of this Agreement.

6. Remedy

The Receiving Party acknowledges and agrees that in the event of a breach of this Agreement by the Receiving Party, the Disclosing Party will suffer irreparable harm and will therefore be entitled to seek specific performance or injunctive relief or any other equitable remedy to enforce this Agreement.

7. No License

This Agreement does not grant the Receiving Party any license, express or implied or other rights of any kind whatsoever in the Confidential Information.

8. No Assignment

Receiving Party shall not assign this Agreement to any other party without the prior written consent of the Disclosing Party.

9. Severability

If a court finds any provision of this Agreement invalid or unenforceable, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions shall not in any way be affected or impaired thereby.

10. Integration

This Agreement expresses the complete understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter and supersedes all prior proposals, agreements, representations, and understandings. This Agreement may not be amended except in a writing signed by both parties.

11. Governing Law

This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of India and the courts of Chandigarh, shall have exclusive jurisdiction to decide any dispute related to this Agreement.

12. Waiver

The failure to exercise any right or delay in exercising any such right provided in this Agreement shall not be considered as a waiver of prior or subsequent rights.

This Agreement and each party's obligations shall be binding on the representatives, assigns, and successors of such party.
